



## 2011 CANADIAN 4-H CLASSIC

Open to 4-H dairy calf club members **over 12 years of age to 21 years of age**, as of January 1, 2011 with a 2011 dairy calf project.

1. To be eligible to show at the 2011 Canadian 4-H Classic, the 4-H member must have pre-registered the project calf by June 1, 2011. Only one (1) calf project per 4-H member may be pre-registered. The local 4-H dairy calf club leader must verify that the member's project is completed at the time of entry.
2. The Canadian 4-H Classic Committee suggests that the following guidelines be used in the team selection:
  - There is no limitation on the number of times that an individual member can compete in the Canadian 4-H Classic.
  - Such a limitation may disqualify the county/district or province from attending.
  - The 4-H'er must complete their 4-H project for the year.
  - Selection should be based on more than the results from one show.
  - The selection committee is encouraged to enlist assistance from recognized judges that may have seen the 4-H member and their project calf on numerous occasions throughout the year.
  - Each county / district / province will select a team that includes the five (5) best conformation calves, followed by the best three (3) showpersons who are not involved with the five (5) best conformation calves.
3. **The number of entries that will be accepted is as follows:**
  - Ontario: A maximum of eight (8) calves per county/district
  - Quebec: A maximum of eight (8) calves from each of the six designated areas
  - Other provinces: A maximum of ten calves per province
4. **Contestants age classifications for showmanship are as follows:**
  - Junior: 12-14 as of January 1, 2011
  - Intermediate 15-17 as of January 1, 2011
  - Senior 18-21 as of January 1, 2011

In the case when the Grand Champion Showperson from a previous year wishes to return to the Canadian 4-H Classic, that person will be allowed to show in the conformation class only. That county/district or province will be eligible to send an extra calf to compete in the Showmanship class. They must be so designated at the time of entry.

### 5. **Conformation Classes:**

- Junior Heifer March 1, 2011 to May 31, 2011
- Intermediate Heifer December 1, 2010 to the last day of February, 2011
- Senior Heifer September 1, 2010 to November 30, 2010
- Summer Yearling June 1, 2010 to August 31, 2010
- Junior Yearling March 1, 2010 to May 31, 2010

Note:

- (a) All breeds must be tagged with an NLID RFID panel and button tags to show at the Canadian 4-H Classic.
- (b) **All calves must be registered with the breed association with a minimum 75% purity level.**
- (c) Registration papers must be brought to the show and be presented at the time of registration or no later than 8:00 p.m. on Saturday. Those 4-Hers who have calves competing at the Quebec International Show must have registration papers to the organizing committee by 8:00 p.m. Saturday night as well. Penalties will be given for counties that have papers handed in late.
- (d) The Grand Champion Calf and the Grand Champion Showperson must be able to stay for the award presentations on the Monday evening Royal Horse Show at approximately 8 p.m.

6. All breeds with at least 10 participants will show on their own. At the discretion of the organizing committee, breeds may be grouped or divided within breed by age.

**7. Group of Three Calves:**

Counties/provincial groups are invited to enter a group of three calves. A county/provincial group may enter a second group of three (3) calves provided they are other dairy breeds. Any assistance required to set up groups of three in the show ring must be performed by 4-H members in whites only.

**8. Registration:**

At the time of registration on Saturday, the following information is required:

- (a) Registration papers of all the calves in the group (see Rule 5.b).
- (b) For out-of-province members that are eligible for out-of-province travel assistance, a photocopy of the airline ticket or photocopy of the purchase receipt is required.

**9. Sickness of Calves:**

If the 4-H calf project that is pre-registered by June 1, 2011 becomes ill or dies, the 4-H member will not be eligible to participate at the 2011 Canadian 4-H Classic. Infectious Diseases: Calves having an infectious or contagious disease while participating in the Canadian 4-H Classic will be dealt with in accordance with Royal Agricultural Winter Fair rules.

**11. Professionalism:**

Only 4-H members registered with the show committee will be allowed to prepare or clip calves at the show. (Counties, districts, or provinces that include a herdsman must register that 4-H member at the time of registration on Saturday.) All clipping, conditioning, or grooming, must be done by a 4-H member (showing in the Classic or registered as a county herdsman) in the designated Canadian 4-H Classic stall area.



*The following practices or procedures are unacceptable in the show ring of registered dairy cattle:*

- *Misrepresenting the age or ownership of an animal*
- *Filling an animal's rumen unnaturally with liquid (tubing)*
- *Administering epidural anaesthesia (blocking tails) and/or applying any irritant either externally or internally to the perineal (rectum and vagina) area*
- *Inserting foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline (including hair not attached to its own hair follicle) or on the feet. (Administration of acceptable medications, and false switches and tails is permitted.)*
- *Performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.*
- *Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show.*
- *Wrapping hocks or draining fluid from hocks unless authorized by a veterinarian at the show.*

*The Canadian 4-H Classic Committee will enforce the above Rules and Regulations for Showing Dairy Cattle. Violators may be suspended for up to one year.*

**12. Penalty Points**

The Canadian 4-H Classic committee would like full cooperation of all participants, chaperones, leaders and parents during the duration of the show. If a violation is viewed by a Canadian 4-H Classic committee member then penalty points will be issued to the county/region/province that the participant is representing. Listed below are the penalty points that may be issued;

- *Late Pedigree – 1 point per pedigree*
- *Late Marshalling – 1 point per participant*
- *Use of Cattle Chutes – 10 points per chute*
- *Misconduct of participant – 2 points per participant*
- *Section #11 of Rules and Regulations – 2 points per participant*

The use of cattle chutes are prohibited based on the safety of moving cattle and people through the pack areas and the aisles as they become very congested during peak visitor times. Designated clipping areas are assigned for clipping.

### **13. Measurement of Hair**

Toplines will be measured on Sunday evening prior to the showmanship preliminaries. If a calf is above the 1½ inch criteria then they are able to show in the showmanship classes, but it will be rechecked prior to the conformation classes. If the calf's topline remains above the 1½ inch criteria, then the competitor is unable to show in the conformation classes. The Classic Committee decision is final.

### **14. Needles**

Sharpie containers are to be used for disposal of any needles. We ask that you not remove any Sharpie containers that have been installed by the Royal Winter Fair and that you contact a Canadian 4-H Classic committee member if you have any concerns with the container.

### **15. Best Exhibit Competition:**

The quality of the exhibits is improving each year. Please read the guidelines thoroughly (same as last year).

### **16. Travel Assistance:**

British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland:

- The Royal has agreed to reimburse 50% of the airfare cost for up to ten (10) competitors and one leader per province to a maximum of \$150.00/person.
- Each province is to make their own travel arrangements and purchase their tickets.
- Each competitor is to bring a photocopy of their ticket or the actual airline ticket to the registration desk. The airfare reimbursement will be based on the ticket cost information being presented at the registration desk. No payment will be made without ticket cost information being presented at the time of registration.
- The reimbursement cheque will be mailed to the Contact Person after the show by the Royal Winter Fair.

Ontario and Quebec:

- No travel assistance.
- Competitors are responsible for transportation to Toronto and return.

### **17. Accommodation Assistance:**

Accommodation assistance will be provided in the amount of \$25.00 per contestant showing at the Classic plus one (1) chaperone per group will be mailed after the show.

### **18. Hotels:**

Groups are responsible for making their own hotel reservations. A listing was sent earlier as hotel space is limited this year due to several other functions taking place at the same time as the Royal. A shuttle service for competitors and chaperones will be provided by the RAWF from the two designated hotels only. Pick up times and locations will be provided at the time of registration on Saturday. At this time, the two designated hotels are The Hilton Garden Inn, 200 Dundas St. East and the Westin Harbour Castle, 1 Harbour Square.

### **19. Passes:**

- RAWF passes will be mailed out to group chaperones before the Royal for initial entry to the grounds. Additional passes will be distributed at the time of registration on Saturday. Passes will be limited to one (1) pass per competitor to a maximum of eight (8) passes per county/district or ten (10) per province, plus one (1) pass for the team chaperone and (1) for the herdsman. Additional passes may be purchased directly from the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair.
- Parking passes are not available. Alternate Truck and Trailer parking is available off premises.

### **20. Meals:**

- Breakfast will be provided on Sunday and Monday mornings.
- Supper will be provided on Sunday night, prior to Showmanship Preliminaries.
- A ticket will be provided for a slice of pizza and a drink to be used at own discretion.

## 21. Pre-Registration:


Pre-registration for Ontario must have been completed by June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011. Only one (1) calf project per 4-H member may be pre-registered. Other provinces must send in their forms by June 17, 2011 to the Ontario Holstein Branch office.

## 22. Entry Forms:

The 4-H members that are selected to compete at the RAWF must complete the 2011 Canadian 4-H Classic Entry Form. The entry form will be sent to the 2011 Contact Person once that information is received by the committee. This entry form must reach the Ontario Holstein Branch by Tuesday, October 11th, 2011 to be entered officially into the show. **Faxed entries are acceptable.**

## 23. Alternates and Herdsperson:

 **Each county may enter one (1) alternate**, who will have their name printed in the catalogue. That alternate must be identified on the entry form, If a team requires additional alternates to compete in order to have a full team, additional alternates can be named at the time of registration, provided they were pre-registered by June 1. The herdsperson may be the alternate or another 4-H dairy member from the county/region/province that has completed their 4-H Dairy project in 2011. **Each team is allowed a maximum of one (1) herdsperson.** This herdsperson must be registered with the Classic committee and must be a 4-H dairy calf club member of the county that they have been registered with for the Classic. **This rule will be strictly enforced.**

## 24. Photo:

You will note on the entry form the clause to give the Canadian 4-H Classic Committee permission to use photographs taken at the show.

## 25. Competition:

A 4-H member may compete in only one Junior Livestock (Bovine) Show at the 2011 RAWF. **Only provided Canadian 4-H Classic Shirts may be worn.** No additional emblem or logos on the shirt.

## 26. Hay/Straw/Feed:

The RAWF has agreed to provide one bale of straw per calf for the Canadian 4-H Classic exhibitors (to be used during the Canadian 4-H Classic). Exhibitors are responsible for their own hay and feed requirements. Exhibitors are also responsible for their own grooming and clean-up supplies.

## 27. County/District/Provincial Contact Person

The Canadian 4-H Classic Committee will correspond with complete show details to these people.

## 28. Improvements:

The Canadian 4-H Classic offers many exciting opportunities and challenges to 4-H competitors, parents, 4-H staff, provincial Classic coordinators, and show organizers. You are invited to forward suggestions for improvements to the succeeding show by February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 to the Ontario Holstein Branch.

## 29. Appreciation:

The Canadian 4-H Classic Committee takes this opportunity to express appreciation to each of you for your assistance in distributing show information to your 4-H clubs and helping make arrangements for your members to travel to and participate at the RAWF. We are hoping that the show will be well attended with 4-H contestants from coast to coast.
