### Special Awards

#### Best Udder Acknowledgment

The Judge will select and verbally acknowledge the Best Udder within each milking class. No Prize monies allotted. Rosette presentation only.

#### Premier Breeder Banner

An Attractive Premier Breeder Banner will be presented by Prodecad Ltd. of Perth, Ontario, to the individual, partnership or institution having the largest number of points that have been won in the individual classes by not more than ten animals, bred but not necessarily owned by the winner. *Premier Breeder points will be calculated using either animals from the same breeding unit or animals carrying the same prefix. All exhibitors must note before the commencement of the show whether they will use animals from the same breeding unit or animals with the same prefix for Premier Breeder calculations.*

### **Premier Exhibitor Banner**

An Attractive Premier Exhibitor Banner will be presented by Prodecad Ltd. of Perth, Ontario, to the individual, partnership or institution having the largest number of points that have been won in the individual classes by not more than ten animals owned by the exhibitor. In the case of jointly bred animals, joint ownership is considered as one exhibitor. No part of the points awarded counts towards the individual score of any of the joint owners.

### **Best Bred and Owned Award**

An Award and ribbon will be presented to the Best Bred and Owned animal in each of the milking classes.

### **Beauty and Utility Award**

A Beauty and Utility rosette will be awarded to the highest composite BCA on a completed official records among first and second place animals in each milking class. BCA is calculated on Milk, Fat and Protein. For eligibility, official production record must be presented to show clerk following class placing or prior to presentation of the award. This award will be presented at the conclusion of the show and is sponsored by the EO/WQ Championship Show Committee.

### **Gaylea Foods Show Production Cash Awards**

Cash Awards of \$50.00 will be presented by a Gay Lea Representative to the Junior 3 year old, Senior 3 year old, 4 year old, 5 year old and Mature Cow with the highest TOTAL kgs of Fat on a completed 305 day record. The cow must be in the top 5 placings in her class to be eligible.

## **Rules and Regulations**

1. All general Rules and Regulations of the Eastern Ontario/Western Quebec Championship Show committee will apply to this show. Rules are subject to change.
2. ENTRIES CLOSE ON SEPTEMBER 16, 2011.  
Entries can be made in three ways:
  1. On the special forms provided. (Photocopy additional forms as required)
  2. By e-mail. Request form from Phyllis MacMaster

  3. Sending a Photocopy of the registration paper (note if change of ownership has occurred please photocopy both the front and back sides of the registration paper)

If using option 1 or 2, the exhibitors must give the following information:

1. Registered name of entry
  2. Registration number of the entry
  3. Date of birth of the entry
  4. Name of Sire of the entry
  5. Names of **ALL** owners as appears on the Registration Paper
3. **ENTRY FEES:**
    1. A fee of \$15.00 per animal for all classes including Junior Herd and Breeder's Herd must accompany the entry forms. Cheques are payable to **EO/WQ CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW**. Entries will be refused and returned unless entry fees are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries. Post-dated cheques are not acceptable. In the case of exhibits being entered and not exhibited, the entry fee will be forfeited. Deadline for entries is September 16, 2011.
    2. **Entries received after September 16, 2011 will be charged a late entry fee of \$25.00. Money must be received by **September 30, 2011** for the entry to be included in the catalogue.**
    3. **Entries made after the catalogue has been printed (including those with no entry fee received) will**

**be charged a late entry fee of \$50.00 and any more than two substitutions shall be charged a 10.00 fee.** Two FREE substitutions will be permitted until Wed. Oct 12 @ 3pm.

**PLEASE NOTE:** No entries will be accepted from any exhibitor, their agent, or other representative who is in arrears for entry fee payments from previous years.

4. **All exhibitors or a representative of the exhibitor (owner) must sign the “STANDARD EXHIBITOR AGREEMENT” form (enclosed) regarding compliance to the code of ethics prior to exhibiting an animal or animals at an Ontario Holstein Branch sanctioned show. NO EXCEPTIONS. Entry form declarations, a signed Standard Exhibitor Agreement form and proof of liability insurance must accompany entries. The above is mandatory otherwise entries will be declined. Please respect the garbage, alcohol and smoking concerns from the University of Guelph, KCAT campus.**
5. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Committee blameless of any loss or accident. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall be responsible for any injury or damage that may be occasioned to any person or thing whomsoever or whatsoever against all claims or demands for loss or damage occasioned thereby. Every exhibitor at the Eastern Ontario /Western Quebec Championship Show shall carry Comprehensive farm liability insurance. A minimum of \$1,000,000 is required with the exhibitor to forward proof of insurance when sending in entries. Failure to forward proof of insurance will result in the entries being returned.
6. Diligence will be used by the Committee, its officers and employees to prevent injury to persons or loss of, or damage to property but they will not be responsible for injury, loss or damage that may occur.
7. Any exhibitor not complying with the rules and regulations made to govern exhibitors and their exhibits, may forfeit all or any portion of the prize money won on their exhibits.
8. All Holsteins exhibited must be purebred or at least 75% of purebred inheritance, registered and recorded on the records of the Association in the name of the exhibitor. No animals will be accepted without a registration certificate or facsimile copy of both sides of a registration certificate from the office of Holstein Canada. **Registration papers and pedigrees must accompany arrival of entries.**
9. Each exhibitor is limited to a maximum (includes 4-H calves) of 15 animals to be shown with no restrictions on multiple exhibits in the individual classes
10. Exhibit Barns will be open on Wednesday, October 12, 2011 from **6:00 a.m.** for exhibitor(s) to prepare stalls, bedding, signs, etc. and to bring cattle in. **NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER BARNs ON TUESDAY OCTOBER 11, 2011** All animals must be on the grounds by 12:00 noon Thursday October 13<sup>th</sup>, 2011. Each exhibitor must check with the Show Superintendent to arrange for reasonable space requirements before bedding or tie up of animals. Animals will be permitted to leave the grounds after 4:00 p.m. on Friday October 14, 2011.
11. Judging will begin **at 9:00 a.m.** on Friday October 14, 2011 and will continue until the show is completed. Judging of the milking senior yearling class will commence **at 1:30 p.m. sharp!**
12. Each animal will be checked against its pedigree prior to being exhibited. Registration papers and pedigrees must accompany entries upon arrival. **All exhibitors will be required to present registration certificates on demand by an official of the show. Failure to comply with this request will disqualify entries and/or animals from being exhibited.**
13. **HEALTH REGULATIONS:** A licensed Veterinarian will be available on the grounds to check all animals prior to showing for contagious diseases. Affected animals will be removed from the premises.

14. Entries are open to the breeders from the following Eastern Ontario Counties: Carleton, Dundas, Frontenac, Glengarry, Grenville, Hastings, Lanark, Leeds, Lennox & Addington, Prince Edward, Prescott, Renfrew, Russell and Stormont. In the Province of Quebec, entries are open to the breeders from the following clubs: Argenteuil, Gatineau, Hull, Laval Papineau, Pontiac, Terrebonne, Two Mountains, Vaudreil, Soulanges, Jacques Cartier, Beauharnois, Huntingdon, Labelle and Chateau Guay.
15. Exhibitors are hereby made aware that by signing the entry form, they accept responsibility for any damage to or loss of property belonging to the premises of the University of Guelph/Kemptville Campus.
16. Exhibitors are hereby informed that fifty percent (50%) of awarded prize money will be deducted from those breeders who remove signs or cattle prior to 4:00 p.m. on Friday October 14, 2011 as stated in this list of Show Rules and Regulations.
17. **All Holstein animals must have a plastic NLID (dairy) bar coded ear tag in order to be exhibited. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
18. Animals on Transfer: Animals are allowed to show on a signed transfer. The Holstein Rep. will remit the registration paper and transfer indicating ownership to Holstein Canada after the show.

### Rules and Regulations For Showing Dairy Cattle

**The following supports good animal husbandry practices at shows, while presenting a positive image to spectators. All exhibitors and their fitters, agents or other representatives agree to abide by the following rules and regulations.**

#### **Part I**

The following practices or procedures are unacceptable in the show ring of registered dairy cattle:

1. misrepresenting the age or ownership of an animal;
2. filling an animal's rumen unnaturally with liquid (tubing);
3. balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
4. treating the udder, internally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation.
5. treating the udder externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation (Allowable practices/substances include sealing and setting teats, and the use of external anti-inflammatory substances for the well-being of the animal.);
6. roping udders and the use of objects to physically improve definition of the suspensory center ligament;
7. administering epidural anaesthesia (blocking tail) and/or applying any irritant either externally or internally to the perineal (rectum and vagina) area;
  1. inserting foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline (including hair not attached to its own hair follicle) or on the feet (administration of acceptable medications, and false switches and tails is permitted.);
  2. performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves;
  3. criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show;
  4. wrapping hocks or draining fluid from hocks unless authorized by a veterinarian at the show.

#### **Part II**

All exhibitors and their fitters, agents or other representatives agree to abide by the following procedures:

1. Exhibitors, agents, employees or other persons acting on behalf of an exhibitor, shall deliver to an inspector upon request any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloths or other material, or samples or any medicine, preparation or substance, whether in liquid form, for the purposes of laboratory analysis.
2. All entries and personal property of the exhibitors, their servants and agents and persons acting on behalf of exhibitors, are subject to inspection by inspectors authorized by a show. All such persons shall co-operate with the inspectors and shall provide all such information in connection with such inspections and shall provide access to the animal and all information reasonably required by inspectors in connection with such inspections and shall provide, if so requested, samples of urine, milk, blood, or any body fluids for analysis.
3. Exhibitors shall remove any udder supports, blankets or other objects limiting the ability of the inspector to undertake a thorough inspection.
4. The exhibitor agrees to act at all times in accordance with the Rules and Regulations for Showing and the Standard procedures, and will accept any final decision made thereunder.
